It not only enabled us to hear how our women leaders were at the end of the year, but also facilitate an intergenerational exchange around the theme for the 16 Days – 'From Peace in the Home to Peace in the World: Making Education Safe For All!'

It also presented an opportunity to reconnect with two of the three young women that feature in the following documentary – Artika and Sainiana – who we first met after TC Winston, in May 2016. Less than a year ago, the young women were nervous about the impact of the category 5 cyclone on the rest of their lives. In form 6 and form 7, or year 12 and 13, it was a critical exam year for the two.

The following documentary takes a look at the challenges as a young woman when you are studying in a leaking tent. When you are told to focus solely on that end goal of exams in the classroom while picking up the pieces back home. It also reveals the domino effect on their mothers as the women that stand behind them hoping for a bright future for the next generation.

PC Fane Lomani, reporting from Tavua:


According to Urmila Kumar, a former advisory counsellor of the Dramasi Settlement - Dramasi, Rabulu and Balata #2 are flooded.

17 members of this community are being sheltered at the Kumar's resident.

Vegetable farms are now underwater - which means expect a low supply of cucumber, tomatoes, watermelon and beans. Livestock has been moved to higher ground but some are dying from the continuous rain and cold. So far 7 goats have died this morning.

Of concern is that the 196 households in these communities are cut off from town with limited food supply which Urmilla says could last maybe for two more days.

"They has been continuous rain since Sunday and so several farms close to the Nalalawa river are flooded. Villagers are aware of evacuation plans and the children who attend Vunikavikaloa Primary School and Ra High School have stayed home this week rather than attend classes in tents".

In Lautoka, Lomolomo advisory councillor Shakuntla Permal reports there are more than 32 homes under water.
