

TC Ella is still a category 2 cyclone as of this morning, but according to Fiji Met is expected to weaken as the day progresses. At this point, TC Ella will only affect North of Fiji with Cikobia and surrounding areas can expect winds picking up from tomorrow morning. Rain is also expected to pick up later tonight.

Women's Weather Watch: TC Ella

In this Women's Weather Watch update on FemTALK89FM, femLINKpacific's Programme Associates speak to Stephen Meke, Senior Forecaster at Fiji Meteorological Office, Adi Vasulevu, convenor for the North including Rabi, Fane Boseiwaqa, convenor for Ba, Tavua and Rakiraki, Disavu Daugunu, Secretary for Tawake Women's Club, Nila Rao, an advisory councillor in Rakiraki, and Mereisi Mara, Treasurer for the Nasaulevu Women's Club.

According to Meke:

1. The forecasted track of TC Ella has now changed and is expected to pass through the North of Vanua Levu; ie the centre to now move to the North of Cikobia.

2. Damaging gale force winds associated with TC Ella can still affect Vanua Levu, Cikobia, Taveuni and nearby smaller islands.

3. Very strong and gusty winds for the Lau group - 25 knots and we expect these winds to increase as TC Ella comes closer.

4. Rest of Viti Levu to expect some strong and gusty winds and rain bands - but not damaging gale force winds.

Stephen Meke, Senior Forecaster for the Fiji Meteorological Centre in Nadi spoke to Hannah Hicks before midday today (May 11) and provided this update:

1. With the current track TCEIIa is expected to move closer to Fiji maybe moving over Cikobia, ie North of Fiji on Saturday night. When it comes in it possibly could intensify to a category 3 system.

2. The entire system will bring strong and damaging gale force winds which will affect mostly Vanua Levu, Taveuni, even Vanuabalavu from Friday night. But strong and gusty winds will also be felt over the eastern parts of Viti Levu come tomorrow night (May 12)

3. On the current track it is expected the centre of the system will be the west of Fiji – Monday (May 15) or even possibly on Tuesday (May 16)


4. TC Ella brings rain - affecting those up in the North, Vanua Levu, Taveuni, Vanuabalavu and more heavy rain from tomorrow night (May 12) even into Saturday as the centre draws near.





As of 5pm today (Fiji time) Severe Tropical Cyclone Donna (Severe TC Donna) is now a Category 4 cyclone with central pressure of 965 HPA and destructive hurricane force winds estimated at about 90knots close to the centre.

LIKELIHOOD OF LATE SEASON CYCLONE TO DEVELOP NEAR VANUATU - TD21F POSES NO DIRECT THREAT TO FIJI.

The Tropical Disturbance (TD21F) has been upgraded to a Tropical Depression status at 9am this morning. TD21F has a central pressure of 1000 HPA was located 12.9 degrees South latitude and 170.9 degrees East longitude (near Vanuatu) or more than 800km northwest of Nadi at 3pm this afternoon.

It is currently slow moving and expected to remain to the far west of Fiji. TD21F does not pose direct threat to Fiji; however the associated trough, cloud and rain bands are anticipated to affect the group.


